



Declaration of Intent of School of Medicine, University of Phayao
on Policy of Not Accepting Any Kind of Gifts for the Performance of Duties
(No Gift Policy), Fiscal Year B.E. 2568 (2025)

The School of Medicine, University of Phayao (MED-UP), as an Autonomous University for human resource and knowledge development, realizes the duties of individuals to be against all form of corruption, including reinforcement of the values of integrity for a modern organization with good governance, honesty, and ethics in a accordance with Section 50 (10) of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Thailand B.E. 2560 (2017), Section 128 of the Organic Act on Anticorruption B.E. 2561 (2018), and the National Reform Plan for prevention and suppression of corruption in the performance of duties or “No Gift Policy”.

To mobilize good governance in organizational management imbued with transparency, accountability, and absence of corruption, University of Phayao, according to Section 33 of the University Act B.E. 2553 (2010), the school of Medicine hereby declares that School of Medicine University of Phayao executives and personnel should not give and accept gifts from their performance of duties, both before or after performance of duties which would be conducive to corruption and misconduct on every festival or occasions. demands the executives and personnel of all levels to refrain from giving and receiving gifts from the performance of duties (No Gift Policy) – during, before, or after performing such duties. All are to abide by the No Gift Policy to suppress corruption and misconduct on any occasions, to observe the UP Code of Ethics, and to build public trust by means of transparency, zero conflict of interest, virtues, moral principles, honesty, fairness, goodwill as well as responsibilities for communities, societies, and the nation, all of which leading to the making of value and integrity for a sustainable organization.

For all MED-UP personnel to strictly adhere to this No Gift Policy Declaration.
